MESSAGE FROM MAYOR LENARD KWASNY

Well, it is not hard to notice that the summer season is nearly over with the leaves on the trees changing color.

As you are all aware our town had a by-election, and I would like to personally thank the three candidates, Julianna Merritt, Sheila Doka and Sheila Pockett for taking interest in the well-being of our Town and letting your name stand. I would also like to congratulate Sheila Pockett on winning the by-election for the position of Town Councilor. I would also like to thank the residents of Onoway for coming out and voting, the turnout was great and demonstrates your interest in our town. Council will be reviewing the non-binding question that was answered during the by-election. The question of whether the residents wished for a forensic audit to be conducted was answered with 138 yes and 36 no.

I would like to thank Public Works for a great job this summer in keeping the Town green, flowers in bloom, potholes filled, as well as other projects which are too many to mention. Also, a BIG thank you to our summer students for a job well done. Good luck with your studies and we hope to see you next summer.

I would also like to thank our Administration staff for their accomplishments, updates to 6 bylaws, 9 polices, website, numerous accounting processes we provide the community, again too many to mention. However updated policies and bylaws allow council to work with direction in an honest manner.

The Onoway Historical Guild held their annual harvest festival which was a great success. They had fantastic attendance and wonderful weather.

September 30 was the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, with public commemoration of the survivors, as well as the children who didn't return home from residential schools. The message that elected officials heard at the AB Munis Convention in September is that we must learn; and we begin to learn by listening and exploring the rich and diverse cultures, experiences and histories of First Nations and Métis peoples - and also understand that our history is entwined.

My wife and myself recently were on a World War 1 /World War 2 battlefields tour in Europe stretching from London England to Amsterdam Netherlands. It was a real eye opener to see the damaged landscape from bombing, shelling, fox holes, bunkers, trenches, cemeteries make you understand the enormous sacrifice the soldiers made to grant us our freedom. It is very important we recognize the service the Royal Canadian Legion provides to our community and support to our active members in the Armed Forces today. The Legion Remembrance banners of members of the community and surrounding area that served will be placed on Lac Ste Anne Trail. Please take time to remember them and their families.


