Did you know that the cost of fire suppression by the fire department for structure, grass or vehicle fires is payable by the property owner? In our area, we have seen structure fires as high as \$28,000 and wildland fires as high as \$12,000

- Be sure to check your home insurance policy or talk to your insurance agent about what exactly your policy covers, and how much it covers
- Besides inquiring about your home structure fire insurance, we encourage you to have a discussion with respect to wildland insurance (a grass fire that could happen that never reaches a building)
- Be advised that should the fire department be dispatched to your residence as a result of a home alarm, a false alarm or, for example, a passerby sees smoke and calls 911, you as the property owner will receive an invoice for these callouts.
- If the fire department is dispatched to assist Alberta Health Services with respect to a medical call, you will NOT be invoiced. This is a free service provided by North West Fire Rescue through Onoway Regional Fire Services

FIRE PITS - BYLAW 723-16

- A minimum of three (3) metres clearance from buildings, property lines and combustible materials is maintained,
- It is placed on non-combustible material such as rock, sand, mineral soil, gravel, or concrete it is constructed of bricks or concrete blocks, heavy gauge metal or other suitable non-combustible material components,
- It has a spark arrestor mesh screen of $8-16\,\mathrm{mm}$ expanded metal (or equivalent) to contain sparks over the fire at all times,
- The fire is supervised at all times by a responsible adult until such time that the fire has been extinguished.
- Flame height does not exceed 90 cm (3.28 feet) above the fire/bbg pit


NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY
