CENSUS – 2021 INFORMATION

The 2021 Census is here! Census data are critical to decision makers and Canadians from coast to coast to coast. In addition to informing public policy, census data are vital for planning schools, hospitals, daycare centres, family services, public transportation, and skills training for employment. Much of the Town's grant funding is based on population. Census data support numerous municipal programs related to infrastructure and public transportation and are used to measure Canada's sustainable development and environmental goals. Information from the 2021 Census will be even more crucial because it will help our community evaluate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and to better plan for the future.

Starting on May 3, 2021, you can complete your census questionnaire online.

Statistics Canada prints a secure access code (SAC) on letters and questionnaires that have been mailed out to dwellings. Once respondents have obtained their SAC, they can use it to access the online questionnaire. This is an easy, secure and convenient option that can be used anywhere, anytime. No pre-registration or lengthy download processes are required. Statistics Canada has adapted the collection process to ensure that all Canadians and their employees remain safe while participating in this vital national exercise. Statistics Canada will do everything it can to get Canadians to respond to the census without an in-person visit from a census employee. Completing the census questionnaire online is the best and fastest way to fulfill the census obligation. The Canadian Government anticipates that the great majority of Canadians will complete the questionnaire through the efficient, secure and user-friendly online application. Respondents without reliable access to the Internet can also call the Census Help Line to complete their census questionnaire over the phone or request a paper questionnaire. This phone number will be in the letter you received from Statistics Canada. In cases where a Statistics Canada census employee is sent to a dwelling for non-response follow-up, a new no-contact protocol will be followed. Under this protocol, no interviews will be conducted inside the respondent's dwelling. These interviews will instead be physically-distanced and the census employee will be required to wear a mask, and follow all public health auidelines.

The Town of Onoway appreciates your active support in helping make the Government of Canada 2021 Census a success.

Let's Get Spiffy!

The Annual Spring Clean-up "Let's Get Spiffy" is set for Friday, May 28, 2021 (from 10 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.) & Saturday, May 29, 2021 (from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.)

This is a service provided for Town residents so they may do a major clean-up of their properties and have disposal services available. The bins will be located at the Public Works yard at 5104-41 Street for people to drop off large items that would not normally be picked up on regular waste collection days.

These items are:

Metals – stoves, refrigerators, other appliances. Wood – including long tree branches, clean construction materials, etc.

NOTE: Residents will need to take WOOD to the Town's Lagoon Site.

Waste – mattresses, chairs and other large items Electronics – T.V., microwaves, etc.

Wire – fencing, electrical wire, etc.

Hazardous Waste – paint, oil, lightbulbs, batteries

There is no charge for this service. This event is open to Town of Onoway residents only so residents must bring proof of residence - such as your tax roll number or utility bill.

Please be advised that the Town of Onoway has put 75% road bans on effective March 22, 2021. This applies to Lac Ste Anne Trail north and south, 52st north and south, 47ave and Industrial Ave.



FireSmart Canada and its partners are committed to safety from wildfire, but they are also concerned about your personal, family and community health and safety. Below are some recommendations to FireSmart audiences via web or social media, the following are do-at-home activities.

- Downloading the FireSmart Begins at Home app and undertaking a structure ignition-zone assessment.
- Raking and removing pine needles and dry leaves within a minimum of 1.5 metres of a home's foundation. As time permits, continue up to a 10-metre distance around the home. Dispose of collected debris in appropriate trash receptacles.
- Cleaning pine needles from roof and gutters.
- Getting out your measuring tape and seeing how close wood piles are located to the home. If closer than 10 metres, relocating and moving the pile at least 10 metres from structures.
- Sweeping porches and decks to clear them of leaves and pine needles. Raking under decks, porches, sheds and play structures.
- Mowing grass to a height of 10 centimetres or less.
- Removing items stored under decks and porches and relocating them to a storage shed, garage, or basement. Gasoline cans and portable propane tanks should never be stored indoors and should be located away from the home.

INSURANCE COVERAGE – FIRES

The cost of fire suppression by the Fire Department for structure, grass or vehicle fires is payable by the Property owner.



You may also be invoiced for alarms, including false alarms.

Medical Assistance Responses are a free service provided by your Fire Department.

Be sure to check your home insurance policy or talk to your insurance agent about what exactly your policy covers and the amount of your coverage.



Waste, Organics, Recycling Update

Standstone will be collecting Organics beginning **May 4**, until **November 1**. The **ORGANICS** cart is for **YARD WASTE** only, as it will be accepted at our local Highway 43 Waste Commission for composting and ground cover. Below is a list of acceptable items to place in the Organics cart.

PLEASE NOTE

Any **contaminated carts** will be identified and flagged as contaminants. The contaminated load will be taken directly to Highway 43 Landfill and deposited as **WASTE**, instead of **ORGANICS**. This additional cost will be paid the municipality and will be passed on to the resident.

Town Update

There are changes to what can be composted and recycled. These are changing markets, both in terms of costs but also in what is accepted and not accepted, and the potential costs should the restrictions not be adhered to could be significant to both the municipality and the individual landowner. On the May 4 pickup day, the contractor went around and identified the material in the organics carts. If the material in the organic cart was contaminated (materials not accepted as identified above) a yellow sticker was put on the cart and that cart was disposed of with household waste materials instead of being composted. The disposal of this contaminated material will be an additional charge to the Town of Onoway and not accounted for in our operating budget, therefore, these costs will be charged back to the property owner in future weeks or will be recovered from all property owners.
