Cats - the Town has an animal bylaw in place which includes cats. Highlights include: no more than two cats on any one property, cats must be licensed and have a tag, cats can not run at large in the community. **The Town is looking at opportunities to address the cat concerns within Town and we encourage all cat owners to take steps now to review this bylaw and ensure they are adhering to same.**

Nomination Papers are available from January 1, 2021 - September 20, 2021 and are accepted until 12:00 pm (noon) on September 20, 2021.

Voting takes place on Monday, October 18, 2021 from 10:00 am until 8:00 pm at the Heritage Centre

INSURANCE COVERAGE – FIRES

The cost of fire suppression by the Fire Department for structure, grass or vehicle fires is payable by the Property owner.

You may also be invoiced for alarms, including false alarms.
