Snow Clearing and Public Works

During the winter months, Public Works will be doing a combination of pushing the snow onto boulevards and streets and hauling the snow away. Public Works will be putting signage up in areas prior to major snow clearing asking people not to park on the street. Violators will be tagged and towed at their expense. Public Works also asks that you don't shovel your sidewalk snow onto the streets after they have already gone by with the equipment. Cats/ COMMUNITY PEACE OFFICERS

The Town has an animal bylaw in place that includes cats. Highlights include: no more than two cats on any one property, cats must be licensed and have a tag, cats can not run at large in the community. The Town is looking at opportunities to address the cat concerns within Town and we encourage all cat owners to take steps now to review this bylaw and ensure they are adhering to same. Our Community Peace Officers will be working with offenders to educate them in an effort to get the problem with the excessive cat population under control.
