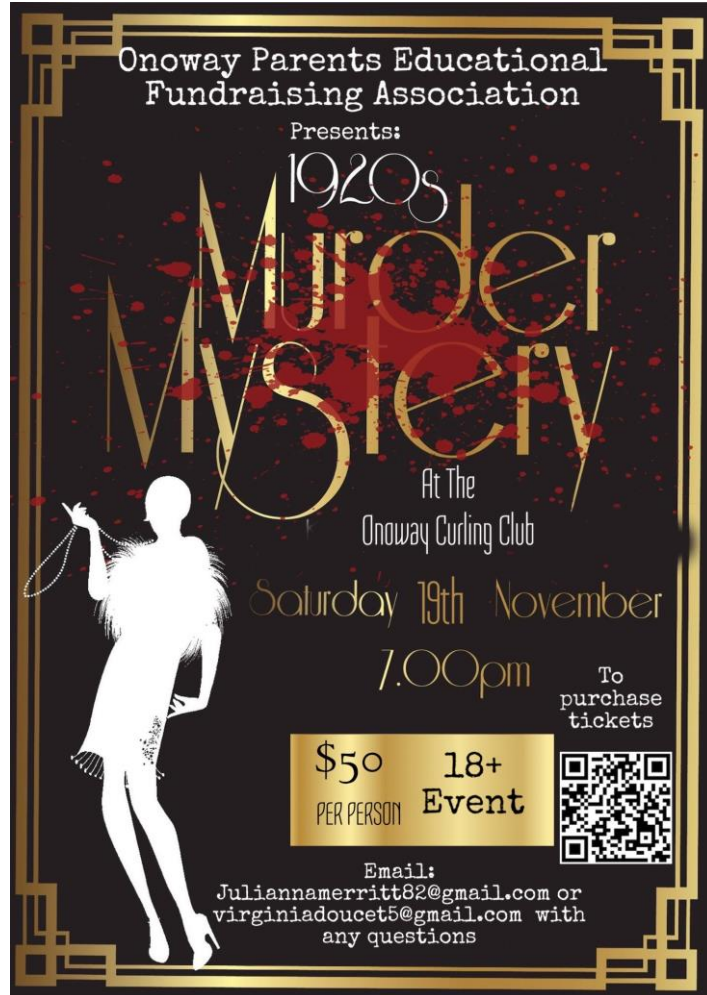
COMMUNITY FUTURES YELLOWHEAD EAST UPDATE
