I had the pleasure of attending numerous meetings of the "Onoway Electrification Association" of which Ed was a Board Director. Ed most recently was the Honorary Parade Marshall at Onoway's 100th Anniversary celebration on June 24, 2023. **Thank you** Ed for the many contributions you have provided to our community. You will be greatly missed by your family, friends, and the many acquaintances you have made over the years.

We have just seen another wonderful October, with some fascinating fall colors of orange, red and gold.

Council held their Organizational meeting on October 26, and I would like to thank all my fellow Councillors for the support they provided in reelecting me as your Mayor for the 2023-24 year. Also thank you for supporting Councillor Lisa Johnson as your Deputy Mayor. I would also like to thank the rest of Council for committing to be the Town representative on the numerous boards and committees we are involved in. Thanks is extended to Ed Gallagher from Patriot Law for attending two of our recent Council meetings to administer the oath of office to Councillor Pockett, and attending the Organizational Meeting to administer the oath to Deputy Mayor Lisa Johnson and myself. I look forward to a very successful year.

During the by-election of September 11, 2023 Council chose to ask a non-binding question of the electors of the municipality. The electors of the municipality voted 138 in favor of conducting a forensic audit, with only 36 not being in favor. Council has resolved to complete the forensic audit.

On October 13, Onoway Junior Senior High School held their annual awards night. On behalf of the Town of Onoway I presented the Outstanding Citizenship awards to 4 students in grades 8 to 12.

Branch 132 (Onoway) of the Royal Canadian Legion is holding their annual community service in commemoration of Remembrance Day. The official ceremony will be held at the Alliance Activity Centre in the Onoway Heritage Centre, located at 4708 Lac Ste. Anne Trail North, in the Town of Onoway, commencing at 10:30 am on **Saturday, November 11, 2023**. I hope you will all take a few moments to reflect on this day.

The cost of fire suppression by the Fire Department for structure, grass or vehicle fires is **payable by the property owner.** You will also be invoiced for alarms, including false alarms. Medical Assistance Responses are a free service provided by your Fire Department.
